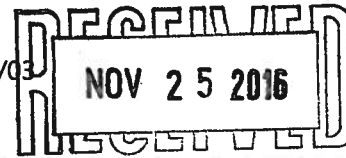

Upcoming Changes to O. Reg. 170/03 for 2017

Testmark and our sister-lab AEL would like to remind all our regulated drinking water clients that, effective January 1, 2017, O. Reg. 170/03 incorporates the following changes:

- New requirement to test for Haloacetic Acids (HAAs) on a quarterly basis. Note that there is no regulatory limit set for this parameter until 2020 (when it will be 0.08 mg/L), but there is a requirement to test.
- Lower limits for carbon tetrachloride, benzene and vinyl chloride
- New limit for MCPA (0.1 mg/L)

Also, if you are wondering about the proposed changes noted in the [EBR posting #012-8244](#), which included items such removing a combined nitrate + nitrite standard and removing the requirement to submit a summary report for lead testing, we have confirmed with the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Changes (MOECC) that these are still under review. We will seek to update you on these changes when/if they come into effect.
